### Part-Time EMTs, A-EMT, and Paramedic

Leland Township Fire and Rescue is accepting applications for part-time positions of EMT, A-EMT, and Paramedic to fill a newly created staffing spot within the department. In April of 2020 the Leland Township Fire & Rescue Department will begin staffing a currently unstaffed station, located within the village of Leland, on a 24 hour basis.

Leland Township is located along the western edge of Leelanau County, northwest of Traverse City, and is situated on the shores of Lake Michigan and portions of Lake Leelanau. The Leland Township Fire Department provides service to the businesses, residents, guests, and visitors of the villages of Lake Leelanau and Leland - including the historic *Fishtown*. We respond on about 450 calls annually and provide Advanced Life Support services to the community.

The most desirable candidates will be the right fit for the seasonal dynamics of Leland Township and they will find Leland Township is the right fit for them. Desirable candidates will live in Leland Township however candidates may maintain residency within fifty (50) miles of either Leland Township Fire Station. The most desirable candidates will be certified/ licensed with Firefighter I & II, Hazardous Materials Operation, and EMT, A-EMT, or Paramedic at the time of hiring.

Upon completion of orientation and training Paramedics may be assigned to respond to ALS intercept calls in an Echo vehicle (advanced life support non-transport) and provide ALS care en route to the hospital in a neighboring community's ambulance. All EMS personnel may be requested to respond to and provide care/standby at fire, medical, rescue, training, or special events as needed.

Successful candidates will be expected to work at least three (3) 12-hour shifts per calendar month.

**Education/Certifications:**

- Possession of a High School diploma or the equivalent
- Licensed by the State of Michigan as an EMT, A-EMT, or Paramedic. Candidates currently in the NREMT Paramedic certification/ State of Michigan Licensing processes may apply. Proof of license will be required at time of hire.
- Office of Firefighter Training Driver Trainer course completion or equivalent (such as CEVO)

**Experience:** Experience as an EMT and Firefighter *preferred* but not required.

**Other Requirements:**

- Possession of State of Michigan driver's license.
- Current Basic Life Support Certification
- Authorization by Northwest Regional Medical Control Authority to work as an EMT, A-EMT, or Paramedic within 90 days of hire.
- ACLS, PALS, and PHTLS Certification, as appropriate for license level, or able to obtain within 60 days of hire.
- Basic computer data entry knowledge helpful
